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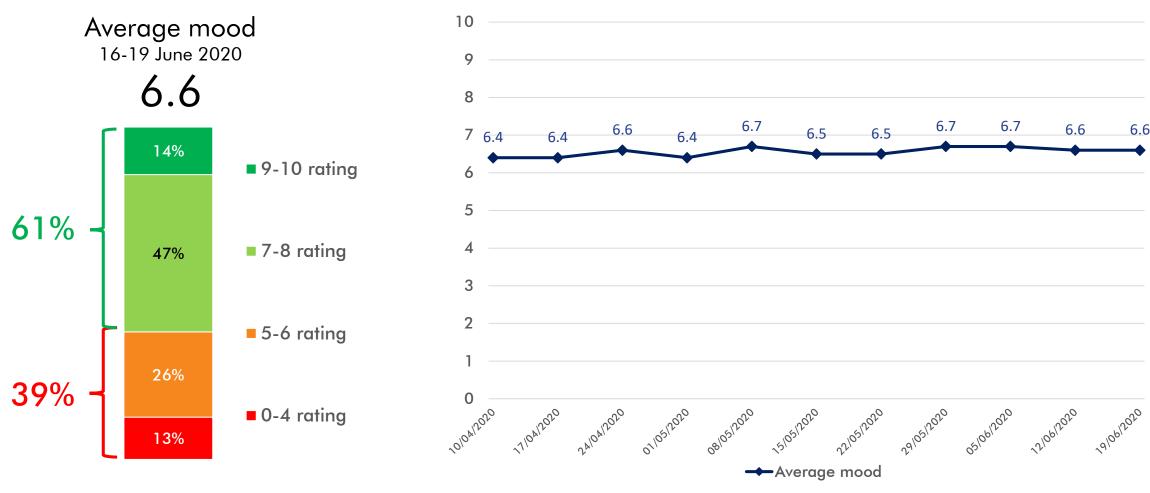

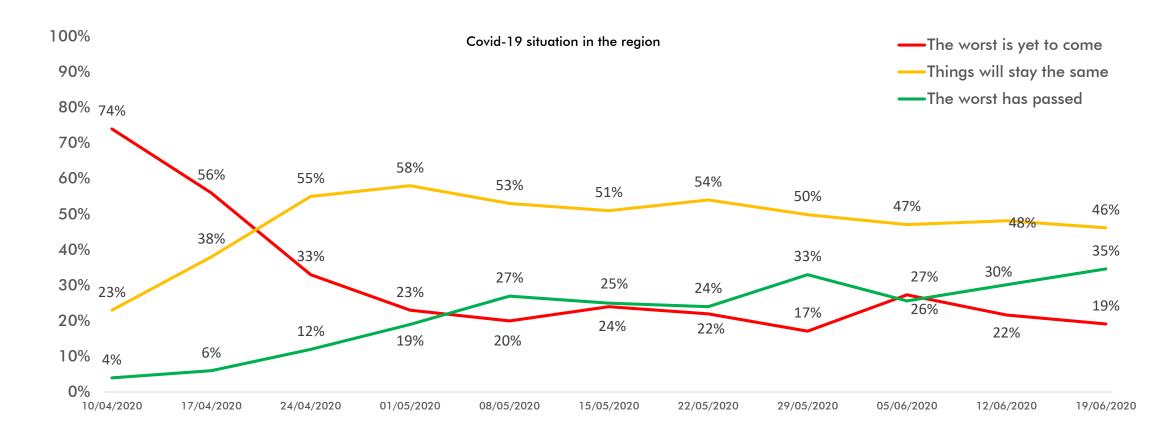
Insight Panel

The mood of the panel has remained broadly constant over the last 11 weeks.





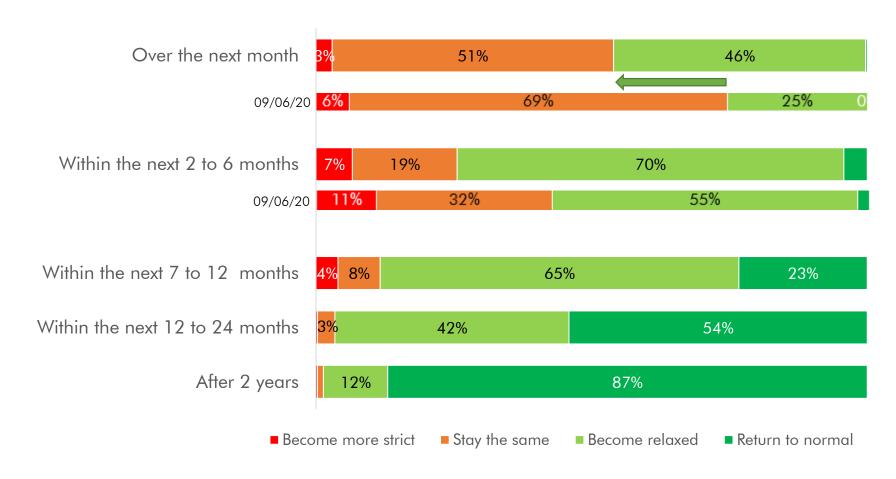
We can report respondents are more positive on the Covid-19 situation in the region this week. The incidence of those that feel the worst has passed is at the highest level we have seen.





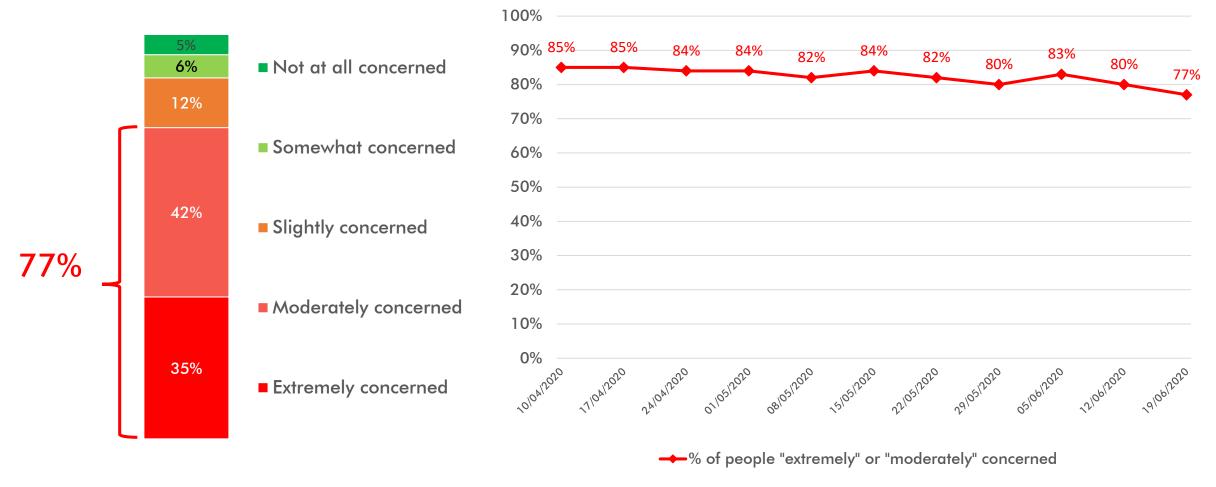

There has been a significant rise in the proportion of people believing social distancing rules will become relaxed over the next month, from 25% last week to 46% this week.





Which is reflected in the proportion of people "extremely" or "moderately" concerned reaching the lowest level we have observed in the 11 weeks of the tracker.

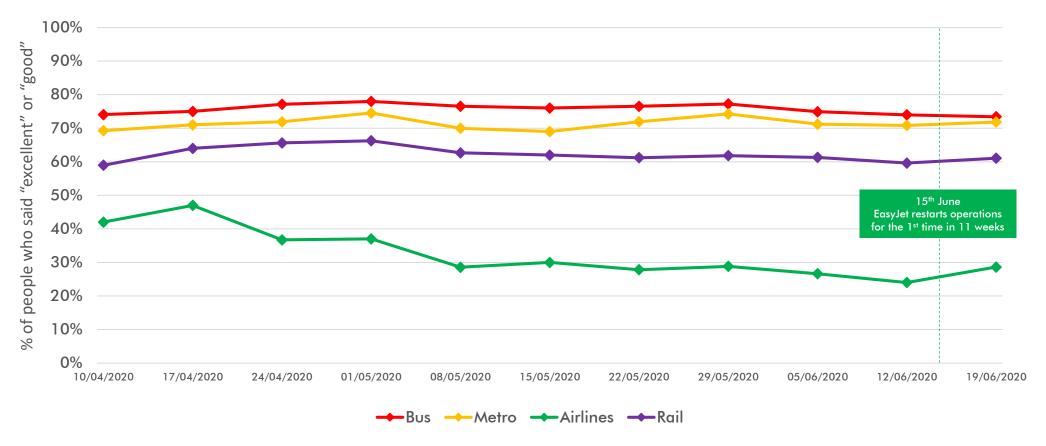




Transport

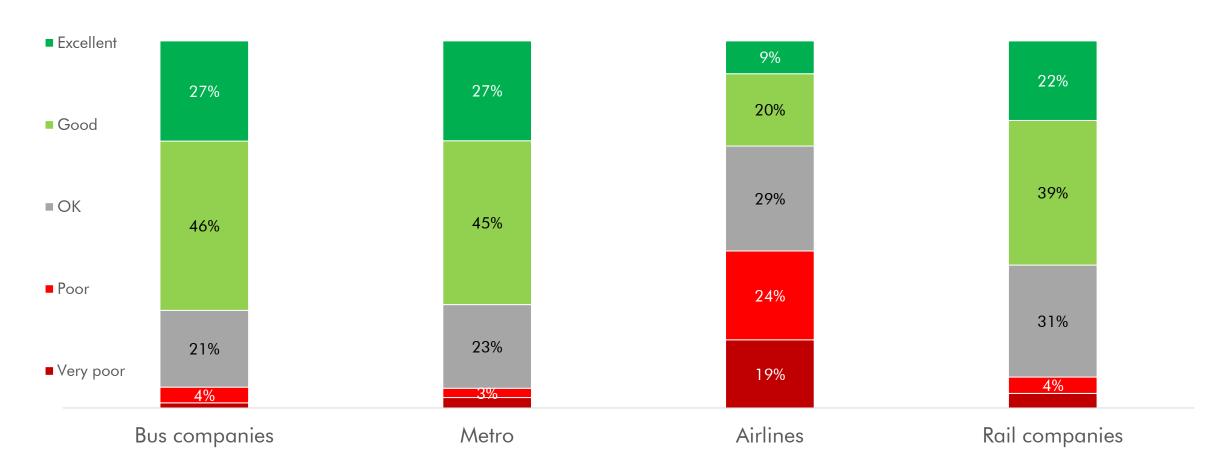


In a week when airlines are gradually gearing up once more after the pandemic left them grounding virtually all their planes, we see an improvement in how people feel they have responded to the pandemic.



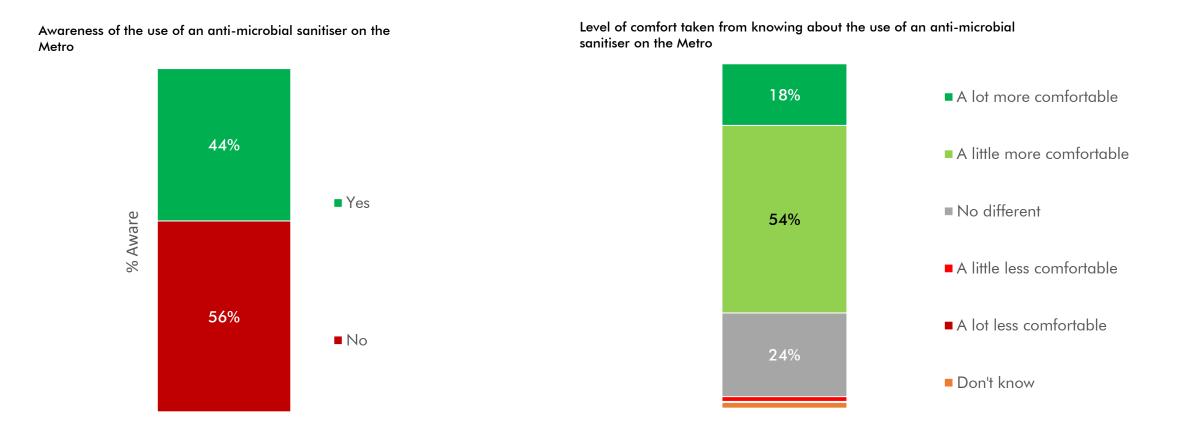


Opinion still shows the majority of people feel metro and bus companies have responded well to the pandemic.





Nearly half of respondents are aware Metro is using an anti-microbial sanitiser to help provide a Covid-secure environment; 7 in 10 people take some comfort from this intervention.

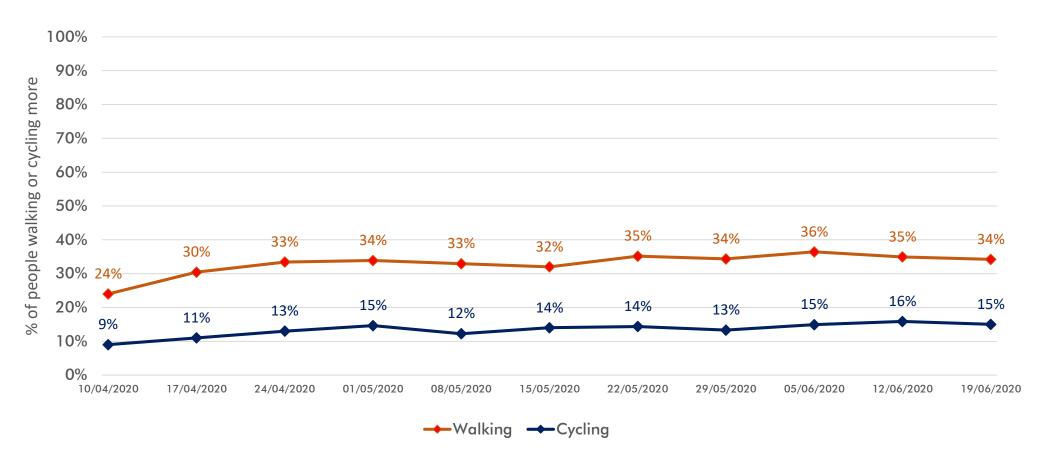


Last week, Metro announced their trains are being treated with a new anti-microbial sanitiser throughout the passenger areas, this sanitiser protects surfaces for up to 30 days. Before today were you aware of this? Base: All respondents n=383

Does the application of the sanitiser to the passenger areas of the Metro make you feel more or less comfortable about travelling on the Metro? Base: Metro users n=383

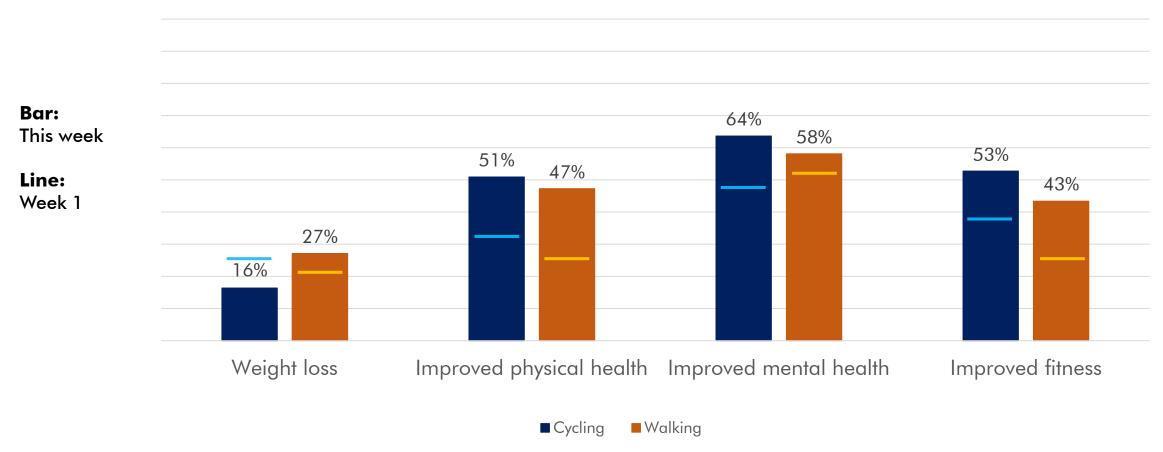


After the initial 4 weeks of growth at the start of the crisis, the number of people walking and cycling more has remained fairly constant.



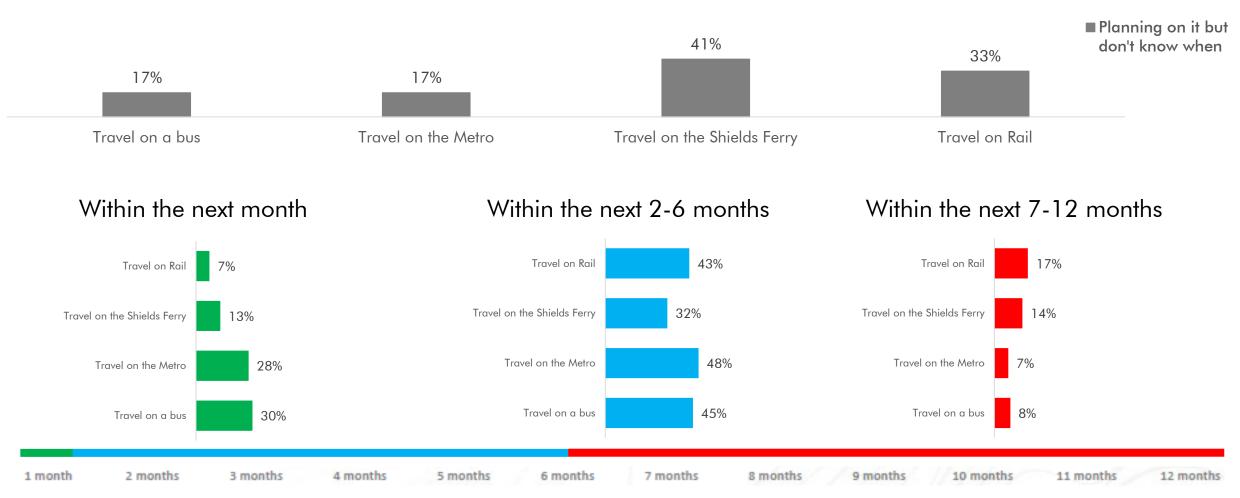


Improved health and fitness levels are still being reported by nearly half of walkers and cyclists.



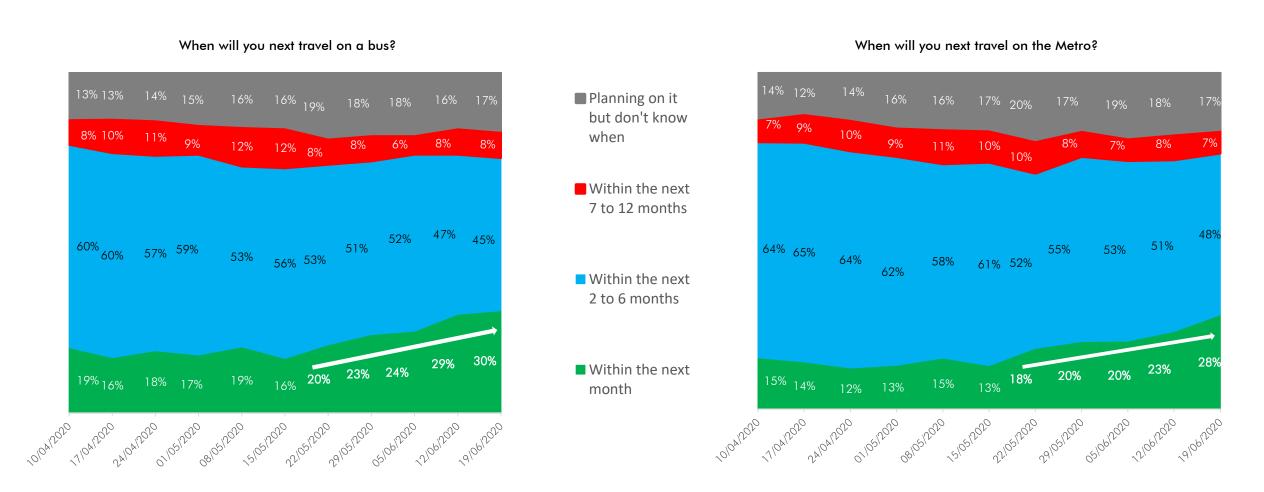


As lockdown measures are eased lead times on the return to public transport are slowly decreasing.



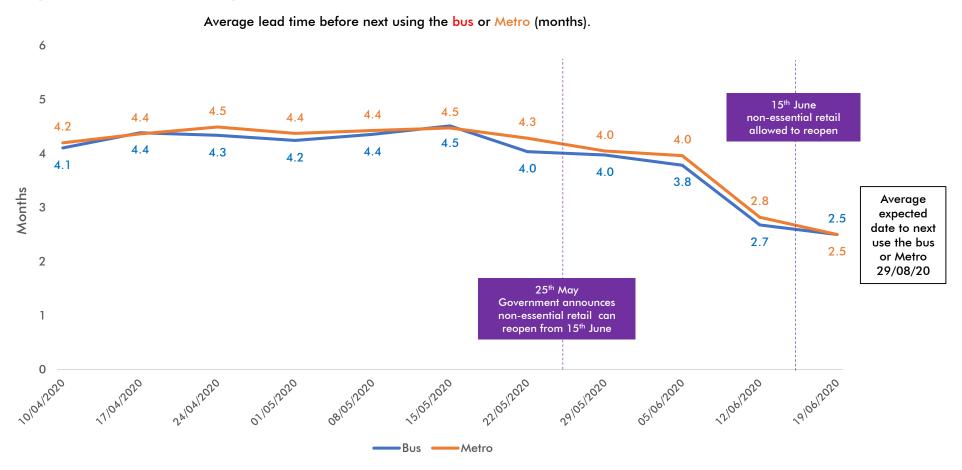


The intention to travel on the Metro and the bus within the next month has doubled since the 15th of May.



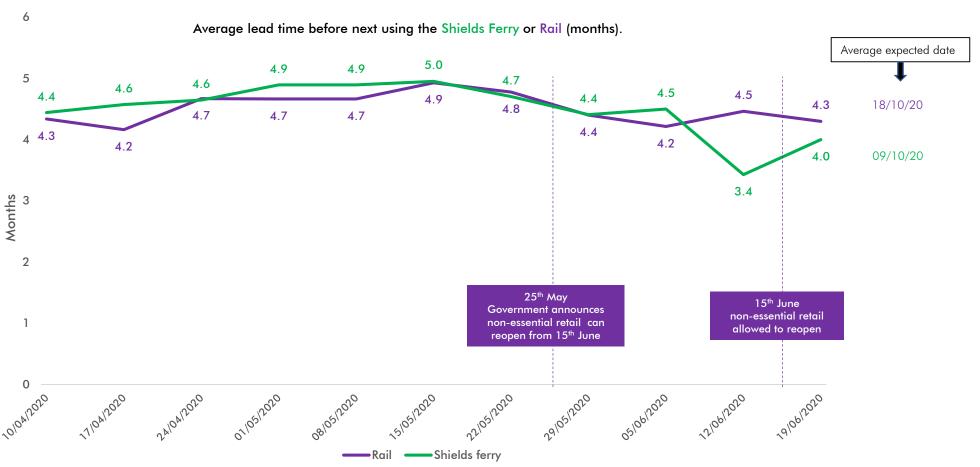


The average lead time to next use the bus or Metro has reached its lowest level of 2.5 months, a fall of 2 months from its high on 15th of May.





Rail lead time remains fairly steady though the Shields Ferry sees an increase following its unusual fall last week.





Last week we asked, "Will you be wearing a face covering when you travel on the Metro next week?". 91% told us they would. Observations carried out tell us 89% of passengers are wearing a face covering.





Travel and leisure



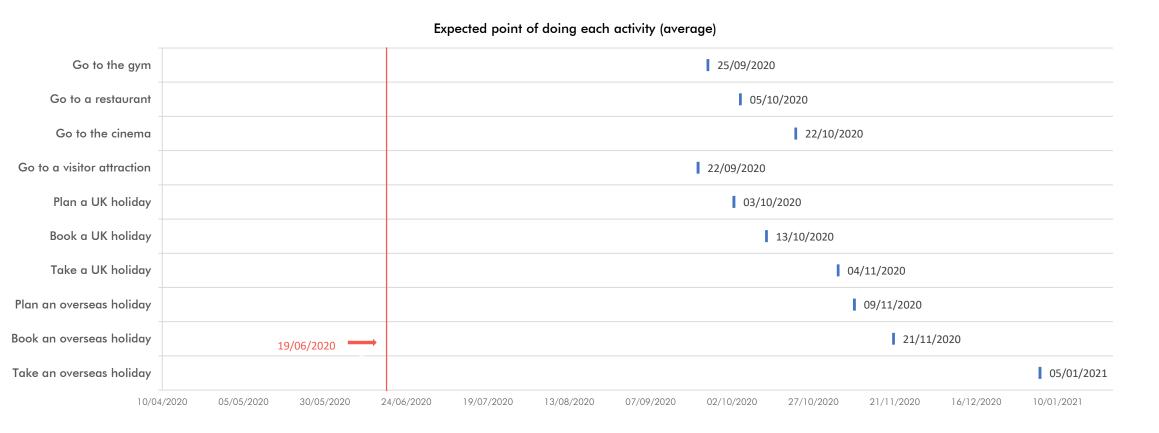
This week some visitor attraction were allowed to reopen, this appears to have sparked an interest in people wanting to visit one.





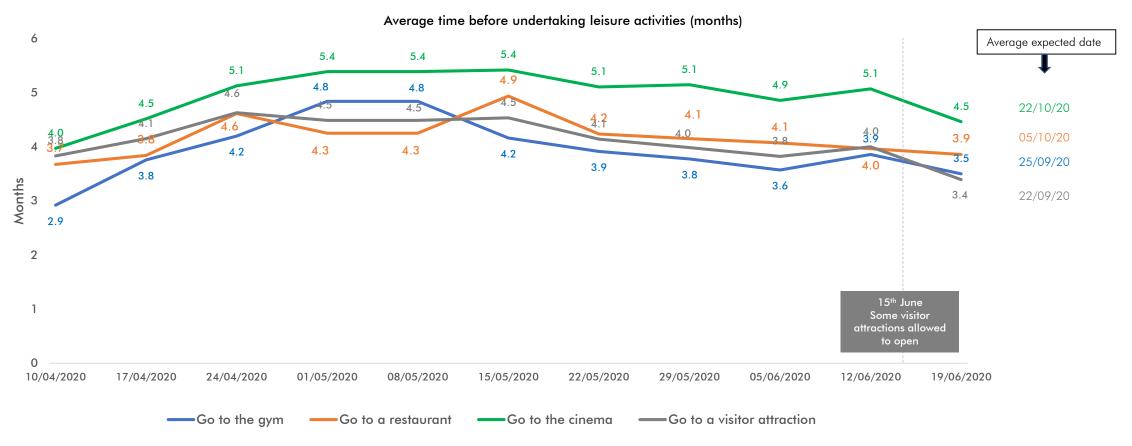


It does not appear that people are planning a Summer staycation, with the average date for taking a UK holiday being in the 1st week of November.



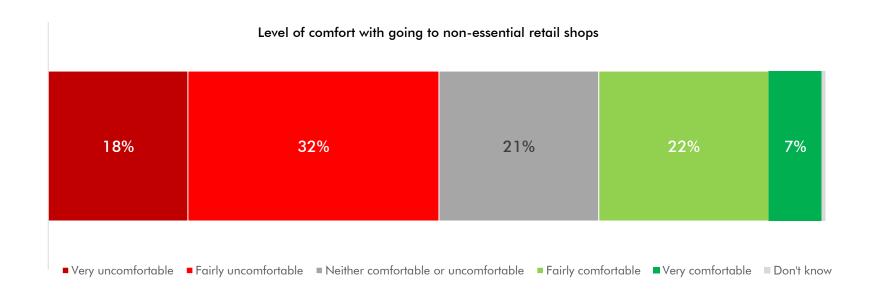


The lead time for engaging in leisure activities has fallen this week, the easing of restrictions in some areas appears to have had an impact on peoples outlook.



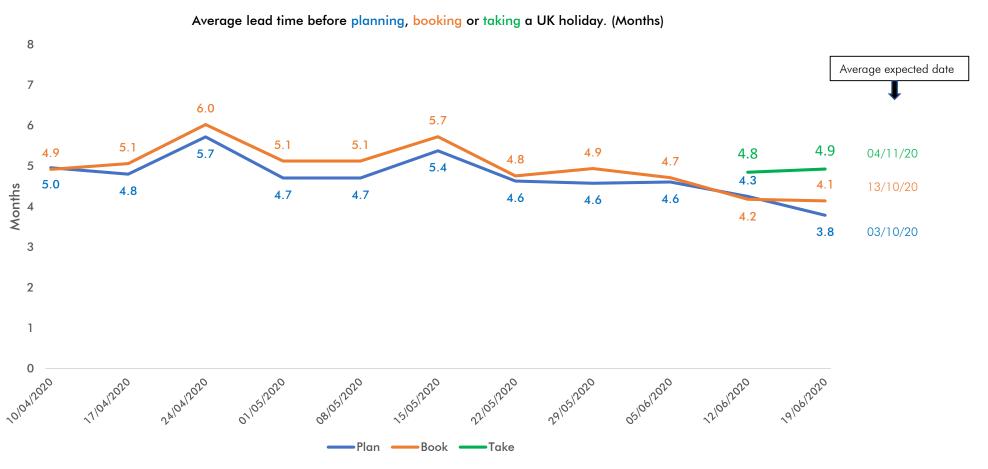

People are looking to plan their UK holiday. Uncertainty over lockdown restrictions may be deterring holidaymakers from booking a break.



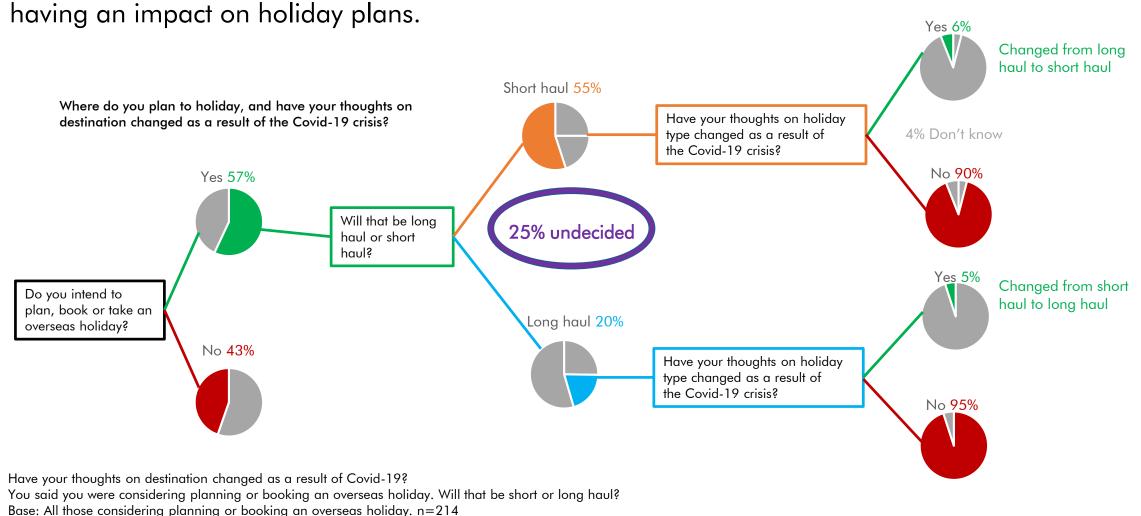


There is a demand for winter sun holidays which may provide an opportunity for the travel industry to recoup some of the losses it will incur over the Summer months.
